At this time, there are no new faces on the staff apart from Mrs McCauley.

Miss Raptis may not be known to you, however, she has been with us in casual capacity over the last two years covering various teaching staff across the school with professionalism and proficiency. We are thrilled to be able to secure her expertise on a regular basis to support the learning of our students.

Similarly, Mrs Gagliano may not be known to you all, however, she is a permanent member of the HHPS staff. She has taken the opportunity to work in a part-time capacity in other schools over the past two years but has now returned to HHPS full-time. We are delighted to have her return and I am sure that the older students will remember her.

As you are likely aware, Mrs Murphy is expecting an addition to her family. We should be fortunate enough to retain her for the beginning of this term, but will sadly need to farewell and wish her well hopefully not until the end of Week 6. We will look forward to sharing her baby news in due course.

Points of clarity/explanation:

Class Teachers

You will note that there are a number of classes which have more than one teacher. The reason for this is two-fold. In some cases, a classroom teacher only has the availability to work part-time. The Department has also allocated resources to relieve Assistant Principals from class one day per week during the roll-out of new curriculum to support its implementation. Mrs Richardson is also relieved from class two days per week in her role as Learning and Support Coordinator.

Class Composition

There are five composite classes this year.

Sometimes composite classes are formed purely through necessity as a result of the number of enrolments in each 'year' group in relation to our staffing entitlement. This is the case in relation to 1/2M and 3/4M.

Sometimes schools elect to form composite classes for contextual reasons. This is the case in relation to the three Stage 3 (Years 5/6) classes.

Although our other six classes are comprised of students from one 'year' group, it could be said that every class is a composite class! As I am sure that everyone is aware, students being in the same 'year' group based on their date of birth does not result in a uniform level of skills, interests, understandings and experiences in a class. The range of skills, interests, understandings and experiences varies in all classes.

Students are selected for all classes based on factors such as their demonstrated social skills, maturity, independence and resilience. Students are not placed in composite classes based on academic ability. Introducing students to new friends in different 'year' groups is an opportunity to practice social skills and broaden peer groups.

Students at Hunters Hill Public School are taught at their point of need and reflective of their 'stage' of learning as set out in the key learning areas of the NSW Syllabus for the Australian Curriculum regardless of their class placement.



Student Assessment

The students have been undertaking a range of universal screening assessments in literacy and numeracy over the past week. As part of our strategy to meet the needs of our students, we need to identify their needs; and we will be using the data collected from assessments to plan our teaching and learning. Their purpose is to identify what students know, how they go about obtaining their answers in some cases, and areas for development and enrichment. They are used for diagnostic purposes and base-line data only and should not be the cause for any unnecessary angst.



Parent Information /Teacher Interviews

We will be holding <u>class information evenings</u> for parents next **Wednesday**, **21 February** 2024. This is an opportunity to meet your child's teacher, see their classroom, and learn a little bit about the class set-up, routines, and expectations.

Times for your class will be forwarded ASAP, with sessions taking place between 5:00pm and 6:30pm.

At the information sessions, parents will also be asked to nominate themselves, if interested, to become this year's Class Parent. Once everyone has had the opportunity to volunteer, class teachers will fill this position.

<u>Individual parent/teacher interviews</u> will be set up for Week 6 (**4 – 8 March**). This is the time to discuss topics related to your individual child.

Bookings will be done via School Bytes and information about how to book will be forwarded soon. **Please note** that parents who are split should make one appointment and attend together wherever possible.

Information sessions and individual parent/teacher interviews will be held in classrooms. We look forward to seeing you here for both of these events.



Student Absence

Whole Day Absences

If your child is away from school you are obliged to advise the school of the reason for the absence within 7 days. This advice must be in writing via the School Bytes app (our preference), via the school email (huntershil-p.school@det.nsw.edu.au) or a hand-written note to the teacher.

Please note the following procedures related to student absence from school.


- Notify the school on the day (or prior) if your child is/will be absent.
 - via the School Bytes app (this is our preferred method)
 - by email (huntershil.p-school@det.nsw.edu.au)
 - via telephone, and send a note with your child on the day that they return to school.
- Notify the school if your child will be absent for more than two days. This is important in assisting us to meet our attendance monitoring obligations, and for us to know that your child is safe.
- If you receive a notification from the school seeking explanation of an absence, take responsive action at your very earliest opportunity.
- You have seven (7) days to provide an explanation of a student absence, or the absence will be recorded as unjustified and unexplained.
- Any planned absence of six days or more must be applied for in advance and approved by the principal.


Partial Absences

Partial absences are not able to be entered via School Bytes.

If you know your child will be **late to school**, please email or telephone the school to let us know. Then, when your child arrives at school they should come to the office, before going to class, to get a late note. If you had not notified us prior, your child should come to the office to get a late note and you will receive a request for explanation.

If you wish to **sign your child out early**, you should come to the office to sign the sign-out book and the office staff will call your child's classroom for them to meet you at the office. Please try to avoid signing out between 11-11:30am and 1-1:45pm as it is more difficult to locate your child at recess/lunch.







Whole School Assemblies and Student Awards

Please be advised as follows regarding whole school assemblies and the receipt of student awards:

- Whole School Assembly will be held from 9:10am on Friday morning in Weeks 5 and 9 of each term (weeks 5 and 8 for Term 1, due to Good Friday). Certificates of Merit and Principal Pins will be awarded at these assemblies. Parents of students receiving these awards will be notified ASAP in Weeks 5 & 9 should they wish to attend the assembly. Parents will also be notified in advance of any other special awards or presentations being made that include their children.
- The deadline for receipt of awards in the office for Certificates of Merit and Principal Pins is Friday afternoon of Weeks 4 and 8 each term.
- Award recipients will be acknowledged in the Weeks 6 and 10 newsletters each term.



K-2 and 3-6 Assemblies

K-2 assemblies are held weekly on a Tuesday afternoon from 2:15pm.

3-6 assemblies are held in Weeks 1, 3, and 7 each term on a Friday morning from 9:10am.

Parents are welcome to attend these assemblies. Class awards are handed out during these assemblies, however, parents are not notified or specifically invited to attend if their child is receiving one.
