Welcome to the Term 2 School Zone Road Safety Newsletter. In this edition we talk about the important role of School Crossing Supervisors as well as reminding drivers about parking rules around school zones.



The role of School Crossing Supervisors

The School Crossing Supervisor program is a state-wide program that contributes to the safety of primary school students. School crossing supervisors help students use the crossings on roads adjacent to or nearby schools.

The School Crossing Supervisor program is an important component of the NSW Government Safety around schools program.



Are you interested in becoming a school crossing supervisor?

School crossing supervisors play an important part in child road safety. The role would suit people who enjoy working with children and who wish to work part-time. The School Crossing Program regularly recruits school crossing supervisors need to be:

- Punctual and reliable
- Vigilant, calm and confident with working near traffic
- Able to provide clear instructions
- Able to communicate with adults and children.

Walk Safely To School Day – Friday 19 May 2023

As you are aware, walking to school has many benefits for students, parents and the surrounding community. Walking with your child will help them develop vital road crossing skills and is an opportunity to teach them about road safety and independence. It also gives you both exercise, gets you out of the car and away from the traffic congestion, reducing air pollution and car dependency.

On Friday 20 May 2022, all students across Australia, are being asked to participate in National Walk Safely to School Day, in conjunction with their school, or independently. For further information visit: walk.com.au.

Parking Rules

Please park safely and legally on the streets around your school. Park legally so you do not incur parking fines and demerit points. Council's Traffic Compliance Officers and NSW Police enforce parking around schools. If you park contrary to the road rules you will be fined!

No Parking Zone

- Drivers may stop in this zone to drop off or pick up passengers or goods for a maximum of 2 minutes.
- The driver MUST remain in or within 3 metres of the vehicle at all times.
- The vehicle must not be left unattended.
- If times of operation are shown on the sign, the restriction only applies during the times shown.
- No Parking zones can also be used to drop off and pick up children.



No Stopping Zone

- · Stopping is not permitted at any time.
- If times of operation are shown on the sign, the restriction only applies during the times shown.





 You must not stop on the road adjacent to another vehicle at any time, even to drop off or pick up passengers.



PENALTIES & DEMERIT POINTS APPLY *

You cannot stop or park your vehicle:



BUS STOP 20m Within 10m of an intersecting road at an intersection without traffic lights (20m with traffic lights), unless a sign states you can park there (see image at left).


PENALTIES & DEMERIT POINTS APPLY *

Within 20m before and 10m after a bus stop (see image at left)

PENALTIES & DEMERIT POINTS APPLY *

Parallel parking

You must park in the same direction of travel and parallel and as close to the kerb as possible.



You can NOT park across driveways or pedestrian kerb ramps. A vehicle can be parked up to the wings on the driveways or ramp (see image)

PENALTIES & DEMERIT POINTS APPLY *

* Penalty amounts are substantially higher for offences committed in School Zones. All penalties are set by the NSW State Government.
